

# **Education Liaison Officer / Marine Educator**

Reporting to the Directors, this role is a key part of a small and enthusiastic team, working together to provide an amazing experience for the visitors to our centre and our wider community.

#### Job Purpose

The purpose of the role is to deliver on our educational outputs. These include the educational outputs of our visitors' centre, delivery of school groups (linking educational outputs with the curriculum), other groups, outreach programmes, events, and various other educational outputs including social media.

### Job Description

- Develop materials for in house and outreach education programs.
- Reaching out to, communicating with, and building relationships with schools and other groups
- Assembles materials, supplies, and equipment for in house workshops, exercises and outreach linking educational outputs to curriculum.
- Ensures safe and efficient operation of teaching and field equipment.
- Communicate knowledge of general science, ideally in biology, geology, chemistry, and oceanography.
- Ability to translate scientific information into understandable terms for our visitors including younger audiences.
- Ability to collaborate with people of diverse backgrounds and experience and to coordinate their efforts to yield programmatic results.
- Awareness and use of standard safety practices in laboratory and field situations.
- Working alongside the rest of the team to host visitors at the centre including members of the public and organised groups
- A belief in the impact of marine education and marine conservation
- Aid the team to ensure the facility is achieving its mission statement goals.
- Responsible for risk assessments and DBS checks, as required for group events
